RE: AB 375, legislation to restore broadband privacy rights

Dear Chairs Hill, Hueso, Jackson, and Vice Chairs Fuller, Morrell, and Moorlach:

We write to inform you that as Internet Service Providers across the state of California, we support the enactment of AB 375, legislation that would require us to provide our customers an opt-in consent before being able to use their personal information for resale to third parties.

We opposed the federal efforts to repeal the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) broadband privacy rules and have maintained a commitment to our customers that we will never engage in selling their personal information, including the websites they visit, the applications they use, and other sensitive data. AB 375 effectively codifies what we believe to be best practices in the industry and will have zero impact on our ability to invest, compete, and innovate.

We commend Assembly Member Chau for taking a lead on restoring broadband privacy rights for Californians and urge your Committees to swiftly approve AB 375 so that it may be enacted into law.
