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Hello,

Based on the information provided, we are currently unable to fulfill your administrative subpoena.

Google requires additional information to ensure that it complies with federal law, specifically the Stored Communications Act ("SCA"). The SCA generally prohibits Google from disclosing to a governmental entity any information pertaining to a customer or subscriber. 18 U.S.C. § 2702(a)(3). While an administrative subpoena can require Google to disclose basic subscriber information, such subpoena must be "authorized by a Federal or State statute." Id., § 2703(c)(2). Section 1509 authorizes subpoenas to obtain records relating to the importation of prohibited merchandise.

At this time, Google does not have sufficient information to evaluate the legal basis for issuance of the subpoena, including whether the subpoena relates to the importation of prohibited merchandise.
