It is being interfered with by something located in a residential house in the adjacent neighborhood to the south, just across the MA/RI state line. It is affecting our use of frequencies between 815.2 to 819.4 mhz.

From what we can tell, the interference (IX) started affecting us in mid-January, but we were able to retune our frequencies around it on a temporary basis. Our field techs began tracking it down in May, and narrowed down to the following address:



They visited the house several times since mid-may, but no one ever answered the door for them. Our field techs are convinced that the IX source is coming from the garage area of

On Monday (6/15), I drove through the neighborhood and observed the IX from the street. From the street, it was difficult for me to conclude that the source is actually at without walking around the houses - potentially trespassing. Therefore I didn't want to proceed any further without assistance from either a police officer or an officer from your field office.

My best guess is that the source is a defective wireless video camera. While observing it with a service monitor, I thought that I heard a video sync pulse in the noise. In addition, it looks similar to video baby monitor that I recently found a few weeks ago in Chelmsford, MA. (It turned out to be a defective Summer Baby Monitor, which has an integrated night-vision camera). In that case, the owner brought it back to Babies R Us, and got a new unit, problem solved.

Prob.Resolution: 11:50AM on scene DF'd along and picked up a weak signal on MDFX in front of residence at Street and nowhere else in the vacinity. Drove to cell tower location and could not pick up anything at ground level. Returned to and using the cavity backed antenna, DF'd the signal to the residence at street. Got permission to go to the back of the house and verified signal was coming from the Residence at Council permission to enter the house from the occupant and found the signal emanating from a baby monitor. Summer Infant SL 020069 # 02720 FCC ID: PZK222T Informed the occupant that the device was defective and causing interference to cellular telephone services and recommended the device be returned for replacement. Occupant aggreed to take the device out of service. Verified IX on 817MHZ was no longer present before leaving.
